Church Membership

We recently gave thanks to God as eight souls were confirmed in the faith and received their first Holy Communion. In the rite of Confirmation, the following question is asked: "Do you intend to hear the Word of God and receive the Lord's Supper faithfully?" We answer, "I do, by the grace of God." It our responsibility together as the people of God to encourage one another in this and to call to repentance those who have strayed.

Currently, St. Peter Lutheran Church has 286 communicant members who have made this vow before God to hear His Word and receive the Sacrament faithfully. We have currently 413 total members in our congregation. This number includes baptized children for whom we are responsible for bringing to God's house and folks who have dropped off without being confirmed. Of these 413 members, 178 have been recorded as attending worship in the last year.

What do we do with this situation? First, we need to keep accurate membership rolls to best care for people. Accurate membership means members who are local and worship most often at St. Peter. When a family begins worshipping elsewhere and plans to be there long-term, they should transfer their membership to the church they are attending. When our children move away, we should help them find a local church to attend and have their membership transferred to that local congregation. These actions keep our membership rolls accurate, helping us to better attend to the needs of those who truly are in our midst. Also helpful are accurate records of church attendance—please fill out the attendance cards in the pews when you are in worship.

Next, we need to acknowledge that the 3rd Commandment (Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy) means that we should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it. God gives us this command because we need His Word! The Holy Spirit creates saving faith in Jesus through the Word and Sacraments and preserves this faith through the same. God commands us to hear His Word because of our great need for it and because of His desire that we be saved by hearing and believing that our sins are forgiven for Christ's sake. Habitually neglecting God's service of Word and Sacrament puts our souls at risk. Neglect of God's gifts turns into despising of His gifts and loss of faith. Separating ourselves physically from the body of Christ leads to a spiritual separation from the body of Christ, putting us outside of the grace of God and under His wrath. For salvation is found only in Him.

Therefore, in love, we reach out to our brothers and sisters who ought to be in our midst and are not. To Christ, each sheep is precious—each is one for whom he died. The ninety-nine are left to go in search of the one, in order to bring that one to repentance. May we as a congregation see each member as important as Jesus does and reach out to them in love, to restore them to the fold where our gracious Savior tends to our needs and leads us to eternal life.





Stewardship Newsletter article - August 2021

When it comes to stewardship, a favorite Bible verse is the account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1–4). It's a moving account. Our Lord praises the seemingly small gift of two copper coins given by a poor widow above the abundance of gifts given by the rich, saying, "Truly, I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them" (Luke 21:3). And that is usually where we stop. But the text goes on. "For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on" (Luke 21:4).

"She ... put in all she had to live on." She gave everything. She held nothing back. She trusted that the Lord who made her and all creatures; who gave her everything she had; who redeemed her from her own sin, from death, and the power of the devil; who called her by the gospel and enlightened her with His gifts of Word and Sacrament; would continue to do this. He would provide her with all that she needed for this body and life because that is the character of the God she had.

But this is not why we give small gifts. Her gift, though it appeared small, was actually large. When we are tempted to give small gifts, it is precisely because we want them to be small! We don't trust the Lord to provide for us. We give small gifts because we lack faith in the One who created us, redeemed us, sanctifies, and keeps us in the one true faith. We give small gifts because we doubt that God will really give us what we need and desire. We give small gifts because we are not content with what God has already given.

So, what have you decided to give? How do I decide what to give? Let the Scriptures be your guide.

We are to give proportionally to what we have received from God's giving to us (Luke 12:48; 1 Corinthians 16:1–2, 2 Corinthians 8:12). But you have not been set free to give nothing. See that you excel in the grace of giving (2 Corinthians 8:7)!

We are not free to live selfishly outside the Gospel, without regard for God who gives us all good gifts, without generosity for our neighbor who needs us and our gifts, without supporting the community of faith in which we live, without care for our spiritual fathers and those who teach and help raise our children in the faith, and without resources for the poor and needy.

In short, we are not free to live unto ourselves, hoarding what God has given us only for us. For love is the fulfillment of the law (Romans 13:10). And the sum of the law is this: Love God and love your neighbor (Matthew 22:34–40). We love because He first loved us. We give because He has given to us.

Luther once said, "Possessions belong in your hands, not in your heart" (LW 14:240). There is a reason your 10 fingers spread apart. With your hands you catch God's gifts for what you need and let the rest fall through your fingers to your neighbors – your family, your friends, your community, your church.
