The Advent of Our Lord

We are entering the Advent season. Often, we think of this time of the year as a pre-Christmas—a time to look forward to celebrating the coming of our Lord Jesus in Bethlehem as a baby born to Mary. Yes, advent is a pre-Christmas in this way, but it is more than an anticipation of celebrating the birth of the Savior many years ago.

Advent also is a time to happily receive our Savior now. Jesus' ascension into heaven was not his withdrawing from His people until he comes again visibly. His ascension into heaven, to the right hand of the Father with all authority, means that Jesus comes to us and is present with us now, even as we wait for his final coming. *Behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age* (Matt. 28:20). As we await the coming of our Lord in glory, we receive him now as he is present with us in Word and Sacrament. This is not some abstract spiritual presence. Christ, who is inseparably both God and man, comes to us. When we gather to receive Christ's gifts, we are with the whole Christ—God and man. Jesus is with us.

A great aid to our recognition of this mystery is the Holy Sacrament of the Body and Blood of our Lord. This great gift really is the New Testament itself—the body and blood of Christ given into death for our sins. The once and for all sacrifice of the true Passover Lamb is given to us to eat and drink. And while this continual coming of the Lord in our midst is hidden, we know it surely by his words—this is my body, this is my blood. The same body that hung on the cross is given to us to eat. The same blood that fell from the crucified Savior is given to us to drink.

As we await the coming of our Lord visibly at the end of the age, we are not at all without an intimate presence with Jesus now. In this Advent season, ponder the mystery not only of Christ's coming at Bethlehem, but also his coming to us today. With his continuing presence among us now, we will be kept safe until He comes again openly and visibly before all the world, bringing to completion our salvation as we join him in glory.

We may enjoy "The Polar Express" but for us it isn't knowing that Santa exists, it is in knowing that the angels have announced that the Savior is born. We can separate a fictional story from the reality of the coming of the Savior. It isn't just the sound of the bells on the sleigh, it is more importantly the sound of the church bell calling us to worship the Newborn King. We can't separate ourselves from the world, but we can strive to keep our focus on the manger, the cross, the open tomb and the ascension of our Savior to open the "Parlor Doors" of heaven for us.

Stewardship News

"A Gift Fit for a King"

"And going into the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh" (Matthew 2:11)

In these figures that the New Testament calls Magi, we see a fitting image for us as stewards. While we don't know much about these strange men who appear suddenly and then just as suddenly disappear, we are left with one very clear image. These Wise Men, whoever they are, brought gifts!

These men, with extravagant generosity, give us a clear focus on our life of worship before the Lord. To a King to which they have no claim on, they bring the best of what they have. Wealth, worship, witness and a foreshadowing on woe is what they give.

Gold is the wealth. It is a gift fit for a king! Frankincense is the worship. The prayers of the ancients were symbolized by the smoke of the incense rising upward (Rev. 8:4). But what about the myrrh? That was an expensive spice for burial. This foreshadows what this Child will do for them, and for us-give His life for the sins of the world as His name means. None of these gifts were cheap. They cost them dearly.

But they didn't see it as a cost. They saw it as worship. This king would be their king. He would be your king too. Consider the gifts you will bring to our king. The gifts that the Lord calls us to bring are best called simple gifts. These gifts are to follow the model of the Magi. Not inexpensive nor seen as costly. But flowing from a heart that is full of glory that is revealed to us in the babe of Bethlehem who has come to die to us. Our gifts flow from gratitude for what our Lord has done for us and the world. They don't have to be golden, fragrant, nor a sign of death. Rather they are to be gifts that rejoice in the new baptismal life we have in this Jesus. The Jesus-who is the Savior revealed to us.
