Therefore, this is my pastoral plea to you. My chief concern is not that church attendance is low. I understand that many are concerned and maybe scared. My primary concern is that Christ's lambs continue to be fed by their Good Shepherd. Please, avail yourselves to Jesus's presence and his gifts. Give me a call, and I will gladly meet you and your household alone at the church to receive the Lord's body and blood. I will happily drive to your house if you would prefer. I will take whatever precautions you would like me to take to make you feel comfortable. Immanuel desires to be with you and for you, giving his gifts of life and salvation. This is the way we his people remain prepared for his coming again in glory as Judge.

God's peace in Jesus Christ be with you this Advent and Christmas—personally and tangibly.

## **December 2020 Stewardship News**

Christmas is coming. It is a joyous time of feasting. The Church feasts upon the Word of God in sermon, song, and sacrament.

We hear the proclamation of the message of the angels: "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:10-11). We mingle our voices with theirs as we sing, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased" (Luke 2:14)! We receive the proclaimed Savior, Christ the Lord, not wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in manger but wrapped in bread and wine placed into our mouths for the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. We feast in great joy indeed because of this great blessing from our Lord and God.

God's people in ancient Israel also feasted with great joy. The Lord showered His abundant blessing on His people. And He commanded them to feast upon it (Deuteronomy 16). ## What is the Heritage Preservation Fund?

It is a newly established fund to provide the money to maintain the St Peter Lutheran Church campus. The Heritage Preservation Fund will allow us the dollars to do special maintenance or improvement projects such as roof replacement, new septic system, etc. without having to secure a loan to accomplish the task.

Did you know that the St Peter Lutheran Church campus is 9+ acres? It has 5 buildings (church, fellowship hall, school, teacherage, parsonage), a cemetery, 2 parking lots, a playground and sports fields. That means there are also 10 restrooms, 9 air conditioners, 12 furnaces and 3 kitchens that have to be maintained.

The Lord has been generous to the St Peter congregation. He has provided us with a beautiful campus. Now, we must continue to be good and faithful stewards of what God has entrusted us. The Heritage Preservation Fund will help us to preserve what the Lord has provided.
