Glory Be to Jesus

Here we are on the doorsteps of July. A school year has come and gone without incident. Children and families have been loved and served. Our congregation has done a lot, and not for ourselves only, but also for the community. God is using St. Peter to touch peoples lives, Glory be to Jesus.

Even as July comes we have much to celebrate. Yes our independence is important as a nation, but our dependence is what we celebrate most prominently as Christians.

As Christians we knew that we were slaves to sin. Because of sin we were eternally separated from God. Yet God in love did not want us to be eternally enslaved to death forever. So Jesus went to fight for us. And just like the revolutionaries that fought for our nations freedom, a freedom hard fought, and won by the blood and sacrifice of lives, so our savior fought and died to win our freedom. Saint Peter writes, "Live as people, who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but live as servants of God." You see, Jesus wants us not to live in independence but in dependence and service.

It would be a mistake to think of our freedom as a license to care only about and live for ourselves. That is what the World has always done since Adam and Eve first declared their independence from God. It was their own selfish independent will that wanted to be like God. That is sin. St Paul says it this way, "But now that you have come to know God, or rather to be known by God, how can you turn back again to the weak and worthless elementary principles of the world, whose slaves you want to be once more?" Galatians 4:9

Jesus in his fight for us in his battle for our freedom, "though he was in the form of God, did not count equality to God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." This truth is also expressed later in Galatians 5, "For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another."

Jesus without a question has won the greatest battle of freedom of all eternity, but the freedom He won for us is not to independence, but a restored dependence on God. And the freedom he won is not to do what we want, as all the World slavishly chases after, but freedom to be able to serve others. Glory be to Jesus.

As we come to this July let us honor our country and those who established it, but I ask you to celebrate our Dependence day. My we always celebrate what Jesus fast for and won for us. May we not depart from church in July, but to depend on God and go to church where ever we may be. And as we look forward to the opportunities this fall may we band together to serve one another and our community. May we come together for the camp out, the Mint Festival, with floats, the parade, and parking duties. May we gather around food with other congregations at the Hog Roast, as well as serving in the soup kitchen and food pantry. Use you freedom in Jesus as an opportunity to serve one another.




