When I was in school, we played a game called "Captain, may I" The rules were simple the captain gave other students who were lined up directions such as, "Take two giant steps forward, or "Take two hops backward." The objective was to be the first to get to the finish line. The trick was you had to reply to the command by saying, "Captain may I take ---" Invariably as the finish line was close the student would forget to respond with the "Captain may I" and was sent back to the beginning.

As God's children we too have many things that we **can** do and also many things that we **may** do. One of our tasks in Christian education is to learn the difference. Christian freedom has its boundaries when what we may and can do may not be good for us or others. We may not have to say, "Captain (God) may I" but we often need to ask ourselves and teach our children, is this a good choice,

The end of the year is in sight and it may be hard to get our students to focus on lessons and what needs to be accomplished. Even as adults we are subject to the same problem of losing our focus. 


